## **Update from the CQS Board**

#### **Update on School Property Projects**

#### Rimu Classroom

The final part of the upgrade to the Rimu classroom was finished over the Term 3 holidays, and the class is now benefiting from an easier to use space that is more fit for purpose for their teaching and learning needs. The classroom looks fantastic and we are glad it has been such a success. For those who have not had the opportunity to see the improvements, we are including a couple of pictures below. Thank you to the entire Rimu class for vacating the space for 6 weeks at the start of Term 3 to allow the work to be complete, and to Leon, Elyse and Keith for their support through the process.







#### Karaka Classroom and Hall

The Ministry of Education (MoE) has selected their 2 preferred contractors who are currently tendering for the weathertightness remediation work on the Hall and Karaka classrooms. The tendering process is expected to be completed early next week, and the board's property team who have been working on this project will be assessing these tenders with the MoE team when the tender process is complete. Once the chosen contractors are engaged by the MoE, and the project scope is finalised, work will commence shortly after.

The current timeline (to be confirmed) is that work will start in late November, with a portion of the playground being cordoned off to allow the contractors a place to work separate to our tamariki's use of the playground space. The school is choosing for the contractors to start work before the end of term, so that we set them up to complete as much work as possible over the summer holidays. This choice has been made to ensure the works cause the least disruption to learning and play as possible for our students. However, as these are significant works, they are scheduled to continue until the end of Term 2 2025. Once the details are finalised and known in the coming weeks, things will likely start to move quickly, so we will update our community on the timeline as soon as we are able to.

We will also continue to update our school website with additional information about the changes that will be occurring at Clyde Quay within the property space over the next year.

#### **Update on CQS Principal Vacancy**

The Principal Appointment Committee (PAC) has been working with a recruitment company for the last few months to progress the hiring process for our next Principal here at Clyde Quay School. Applications for the role closed on Monday 21st October. We have been lucky enough to have received applications from high calibre candidates, which is a testament to the high esteem our kura is held in within our community, and the wider education community.

PAC is currently in the shortlisting process, once the shortlisting process is complete, we will look to undertake interviews of the shortlisted candidates. We are looking forward to being able to provide further updates in the coming weeks.




